the anti fairy tale has long existed in the shadow of the traditional fairy tale as its flipside or evil twin according to andré jolles in *einfache formen* 1930 such antimärchen are contemporaneous with some of the earliest known oral variants of familiar tales while fairy tales are generally characterised by a spirit of optimism tolkien the anti tale offers us no such assurances for every happily ever after there is a dissenting they all died horribly the anti tale is however rarely an outright opposition to the traditional form itself inasmuch as the anti hero is not a villain but may possess attributes of the hero the anti tale appropriates aspects of the fairy tale form and its equivalent genres and re imagines subverts inverts deconstructs or satirises elements of these to present an alternate narrative interpretation outcome or morality in this collection little red riding hood retaliates against the wolf cinderella's stepmother provides her own account of events and snow white evolves into a postmodern vampire tale the familiar becomes unfamiliar revealing the underlying structures dynamics fractures and contradictions within the borrowed tales over the last half century this dissident tradition has become increasingly popular inspiring numerous writers artists musicians and filmmakers although anti tales abound in contemporary art and popular culture the term has been used sporadically in scholarship without being developed or defined while it is clear that the aesthetics of postmodernism have provided fertile creative grounds for this tradition the anti tale is not just a postmodern phenomenon rather the postmodern fairy tale is only part of the picture broadly interdisciplinary in scope this collection of twenty two essays and artwork explores various manifestations of the anti tale from the ancient to the modern including romanticism realism and surrealism along the way

the first book length study of contemporary american children s poetry poetry s playground considers children s poetry in relation to the wider scope of adult poetic discourse while the study of children s poetry has always had a place in the realm of children s literature scholars have not typically considered it in relation to the larger scope of contemporary poetry in this volume joseph t thomas jr explores the playground of children s poetry within the world of contemporary adult poetic discourse bringing the complex social relations of play and games cliques and fashions and drama and humor in children s poetry to light for the first time poetry s playground considers children s poetry published in the united states from the mid twentieth century onward a time when many established adult poets began writing for young audiences through the work of major figures like robert frost gwendolyn brooks carl sandburg randall jarrell theodore roethke shel silverstein and jack prelutsky thomas explores children s poems within the critical and historical

conversations surrounding adult texts arguing at the same time that children's poetry is an oft neglected but crucial part of the American poetic tradition. Canonical issues are central to poetry's playground. The volume begins by tracing Robert Frost's emergence as the United States' official school poet, exploring the political and aesthetic dimensions of his canonization and considering which other poets were pushed aside as a result. The study also includes a look at eight major anthologies of children's poems in the United States, offering a descriptive canon that will be invaluable to future scholarship. Additionally, *Poetry's Playground* addresses poetry actually written and performed by children, exploring the connections between folk poetry produced both on playgrounds and in the classroom. *Poetry's Playground* is a groundbreaking study that makes bold connections between children's and adult poetry. It offers comprehensive coverage of children's literature from medieval chapbooks of moral instruction for children to J.K. Rowling's immensely popular Harry Potter books. Children's experience of poetry is usually of rhyming poetry. Consequently, when they start to write poetry, they frequently sacrifice meaning and sense for rhyme. By exposing children to free verse, many options for self-expression are opened to them. Following a sequence of immersion in poetry, of demonstration and modelling, children become comfortable in writing and sharing different types of poetry: poetry which tells a story, poetry which describes, poetry which recounts, poetry which argues a position. They also discover that poetry provides a form for expressing emotions, for using the language of laughter and tears, and for celebrating life. *Write Me a Poem* presents ideas and strategies for engaging and encouraging children to write, read, and perform poetry. It includes sections on noisy poems, poems for two voices, rhyming poems, and poems that express emotions.
